BE IT ORDAINED, as it is hereby ordained by the Sangguniang Panglungsod of Pasig in session duly assembled, that:

**CHAPTER I
GENERAL PROVISIONS**

SECTION 1. TITLE. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Sanitation Code of Pasig City".

SECTION 2. COVERAGE. This Code shall govern all objects situated within the Pasig City, as specifically enumerated in its provisions and all persons, entities or agencies involved in activities or related fields specifically made subject of regulations by the provisions embodied in this Code.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS. Words and phrases used in this Code shall be understood in the sense indicated hereunder:

- a) **ABATTOIR or SLAUGHTERHOUSE** – the premises duly approved and registered for the purpose of slaughtering animals for human consumption;
- b) **ACCREDITED LABORATORY** – a facility equipped with testing equipment and materials that is duly authorized and accredited by the Bureau of Standards and Facilities of the Department of Health to perform any or specific tests or examinations;
- c) **CITY HEALTH OFFICE (CHO)** – refers to the City Health Office of Pasig City
- d) **DENGUE** – is a viral disease which causes a sudden onset of fever with headache, muscle and joint pains which may vary from a Simple Dengue Fever (SDF) to more serious Dengue Hemorrhagic Fever (DHF) and its fatal form, the Dengue Shock Syndrome (DSS)

- e) CODE – shall refer to the Pasig City Sanitation Code.
- f) ESTABLISHMENT – any structure or building used principally in conducting trade, business or profession;
- g) FOOD ESTABLISHMENT - a place where food or drinks are manufactured, processed, stored, sold and/or served;
- h) FOOD HANDLER – any person who works within a food establishment as defined in this Chapter;
- i) FOOD MANUFACTURING – any activity pertaining to the processing and/or making of food or drinks, such as that are undertaken by bakeries or bakeshops, confectionaries, processed meat plants, soft drink or fruit drink companies;
- j) FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENT – any food establishment that serves food or drinks that may or may not have been prepared elsewhere such as @coffee shop, stand alones, canteen, or cafeteria, panciteria, bistro, carinderia, fast food, refreshment parlor, snack bar, cocktail lounge, disco or night clubs, food kitchen or caterer's premises and other similar establishments that are found in hospitals/medical centers, schools, hotels/motels, boarding houses or dormitories, office buildings/condominium, malls and the like;
- k) FURNITURE – any movable items used in markets, restaurants and similar business establishments such as tables, chairs, ^{and} benches;
- l) GUEST RELATIONS OFFICER (GRO) - male or female employed in a bar, night club or similar establishments where he/she usually provide some small talk, shoulder rub, sing karaoke or dance in exchange for "man/lady's drink", tip or outright fee;
- m) HOMEOWNER - any owner, lessee, usufructory or any person who is residing in/or the occupant of and/or holds any title or interest in a real estate property classified as residential or used as a dwelling place;

- n) IMPERVIOUS MATERIAL – any hardware material that is impenetrable, not susceptible to tarnishing, not affected by the harsh elements of nature such as mild dew, algae, fungi or moisture and with smooth surface that is durable and resistant to wear and corrosion such as stainless steel plates, ceramic tiles, formica sheets, porcelain, marble slabs and other smooth, non-porous and water or moist resistant materials;
- o) MASSAGE – a method wherein the superficial soft parts of the body are rubbed, stroked or kneaded for remedial, aesthetic or hygienic purposes;
- p) MASSAGE CLINIC ATTENDANT – a trained person duly permitted to massage customers under the guidance and supervision of a masseur;
- q) MASSAGE CLINIC/PARLOR – an establishment where massage is administered to customers;
- r) MASSEUR – a trained person who is duly licensed to perform massage and who supervises massage clinic/parlor attendant;
- s) MEAT – the edible part of any animal, slaughtered in the slaughterhouse or abattoir;
- t) NIGHT/DAY CLUB – an establishment open during the night or day usually serving liquor and food, providing a show, or live entertainment, or music and space for dancing;
- u) NON-FOOD HANDLER – any person employed in any business establishment and office other than food establishment within the territorial jurisdiction of Pasig City;
- v) NGOs – non-governmental organizations including civic and people's organization; people's organizations;
- w) PLATELET – microscopic circular or oval disk found in the bloods of mammals;

- x) POULTRY – domestic fowls such as chicken, duck, goose, turkey or other similar animals that are raised for meat and eggs;
- y) PRIVATE MARKET – any place owned by a private individual or entity that is duly licensed by the City Government to operate as a market, including stall, mini markets and supermarkets where fresh and/or frozen livestock, poultry, fish and vegetables are sold;
- z) PUBLIC MARKET – a place designated by the City Government where dry and wet commodities and goods, perishable or non-perishable are sold;
- aa) SANITARY PERMIT TO OPERATE – the document issued by the City Health Office certifying that based on the representations of the Project Proponent, as reviewed and validated by the Sanitary Officer, the proposed project or undertaking will not cause any significant negative environmental sanitation problem and the proponent has complied with all the requirements;
- bb) SAUNA BATH ATTENDANT – a person who applies the proper technique of giving steam bath to customers;
- cc) SAUNA BATH ESTABLISHMENT – an establishment engaged in providing customer with steam bath whereby the steam generated by sprinkling water on hot stones or by some other methods;
- dd) SOLID WASTE - is herein used as an inclusive term for all solid wastes generated by households, commercial and business establishments;
- ee) STALL – an open compartment of area designated for the sale or display of commodities and goods including food products;
- ff) TOILET FACILITY – a structure built of materials of any kind inside or as part of a house or building used by its residents, ← occupants, visitors, employees, transients or customers as a lavatory with septic tank/waste water facility built for the purpose;

- dd) TONSORIAL AND BEAUTY ESTABLISHMENT – business establishment such as barber shops, beauty parlors, figure slenderizing salons, spas and other establishments engaged in the physical make over of an individual, whether female or male;
- ff) WATER FACILITY – any entity engaged in the development of water sources, water abstraction, water treatment and water distribution, water works operators in subdivisions, well abstractors/users, water refilling stations etc.;
- gg) WATER HAULER – any person, firm or entity that obtains water from its source and transports, stores and operates equipment to deliver water for human consumption;

CHAPTER II
HEALTH CERTIFICATE

SECTION 4. Persons employed in all establishments located within the jurisdiction of Pasig City are required to secure a Health Certificate at the CHO.

SECTION 5. Applicants for Health Certificate as required in this Code shall undergo the following trainings and tests and submit the original Certificates of Completion and certifications of the results of the herein tests to CHO:

a. FOR FOOD HANDLERS AND NON-FOOD HANDLERS

- Fecalalysis
- Chest X-Ray with validity of one (1) year
- Urinalysis
- 1 x 1 recent photo
- Community Tax Certificate
- Drug Test

b. FOR NON-FOOD HANDLERS WITHIN NON-FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

- Solid Waste Management and Health & Sanitation Seminars
- 1 x 1 recent photo
- Community Tax Certificate
- Drug Test
- Physical Examination

SECTION 6. The Health Certificate Card shall be issued anytime within the year with validity until the end of the current year and shall be worn by the employee at all times during the period of his/her work or duty;

SECTION 7. All results of laboratory tests and radiologic examinations under Section 5 hereof shall be confirmed by the City Health Laboratory only when necessary.

CHAPTER III
WATER DELIVERY, WATER REFILLING, WATER HAULER AND OTHER WATER SUPPLY FACILITIES

SECTION 8. A Sanitary permit shall be required for every refilled water delivery vehicle and water tanker delivery trucks. They shall secure a Certificate of Water Potability from the City Health office every month. The Certificate issued shall be conspicuously displayed in all vehicles at all times.

SECTION 9. Water Refilling facilities including water vending machines and ice manufacturers shall undergo Monthly Bacteriological Examination and Semi-Annual Physico-chemical Examination and other examinations stated in the recently revised Philippine National Standard for Drinking Water (PNSDW) of 2007 to be conducted by the City Health Laboratory or any accredited water laboratory duly authorized and accredited by the CHO or by Department of Health.

CHAPTER IV
FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS/FOOD MANUFACTURERS/MARKETS

SECTION 10. All persons and/or entities engaged in the operation of food services, food manufacturing and public/private markets for public patronage must secure a Sanitary Permit from the CHO.

SECTION 11. The Sanitary Permit shall be displayed in a conspicuous place in the food services, food manufacturing and public or private markets at all times. Every stall owner in public or private markets shall secure their individual Sanitary Permits.

SECTION 12. All persons employed by a food establishment, public or private market, whether food or non-food handler, are required to secure Health Certificates from the CHO. It shall be renewed every six (6) months subject to the results of health examination conducted on the concerned employee.

SECTION 13. Injection of water and/or application of coloring agents or carcinogenic substances to fresh or frozen livestock, fruits, vegetable and poultry products is strictly prohibited.

SECTION 14. All livestock products sold or used in any food establishment, food manufacturing or public or private markets shall bear the stamp of inspection by an authorized abattoir of Pasig City. Selling of fresh meat, vegetables, poultry and fish shall be made only within the premises of duly designated public markets and duly licensed private markets.

SECTION 15. All public and private markets shall use only impervious materials for the working tables, display counters, walls, partitions and floorings of stalls for meat, poultry, fish, fruits, vegetables, fruits and cooked food.

SECTION 16. The use of wooden furniture in the wet section of public and private markets is strictly prohibited. All crate boxes or any wooden container used shall be supported by palates or stand and should have a clearance of at least six (6) inches from the flooring or ground to avoid contamination.

SECTION 17. All stalls in public and private markets shall be installed with appropriate floor covering inside the stall and shall provide for adequate aqueduct facilities that is connected to a sewerage system or waste water treatment facility.

SECTION 18. ^{18.1} Vendors and traders of fruits, vegetables, fish and meat are prohibited to use colored and/or reflectorized/colored shades in marketing their products.

SECTION 19. All food establishment personnel specially the cooks and other food handlers are required to practice proper hygiene and sanitation in processing food as hereunder enumerated:

- a) wear clean and appropriate working garments and should have hairnets, caps and aprons including gloves if warranted;
- b) observe good personal hygiene;
- c) wash hands thoroughly with soap and water and dry them with a clean or disposable towel or suitable hand drying equipment immediately before working or after visiting the toilet;
- d) no personnel with long, manicured or dirty fingernails shall be allowed to work;
- e) no personnel with active skin infection shall be allowed to work;
- f) no jewelries shall be worn during his/her time of duty.

SECTION 20. All food establishments and food manufacturers are required to use iodized salt in their food preparations in accordance with Ordinance No. 70 s. 1996 entitled "Promoting Salt Iodization Program". All wheel distributors of iodized salt shall undergo a training seminar to be conducted by the Nutrition Division of the CHO.

SECTION 21. The following are the requirements for the issuance of a Sanitary Permit for food service establishments, food manufacturers and on-wheel distributors :

- a) Pest Control Certification on Insect and Vermin Abatement Program
- b) Receipt for payment of Sanitary Permit;
- c) Bacteriological Examination of water source;
- d) Attendance in the Seminars on Proper Food Handling, Proper Waste Disposal and Sanitation Code of Pasig;
- e) Certificate of Training on Wheel Distributors from the Nutrition Division of City Health Office;

SECTION 22. Animals (pets or otherwise) are not allowed inside food establishments, except Bomb Sniffing Dogs or K9 on service or on duty.

SECTION 23. Smoking cigarettes is strictly prohibited in all enclosed and air-conditioned food service and food manufacturing establishments. They may, however, provide a separate area where cigarette smoking may be allowed, provided that the smoking area is completely separated by a wall to prevent cigarette smoke from permeating into the non-smoking area and/or is in an open area and/or is provided with adequate exhaust system. They shall post appropriate "no smoking" and/or "smoking area" sign boards.

SECTION 24. Selling of cigar, cigarettes or other tobacco products as well as intoxicating products to minor shall be prohibited.

CHAPTER V
GENERAL SANITARY REQUIREMENTS

SECTION 25. Wash hand basins equipped with adequate supply of potable water and in proper cases, with soap or paper towels and/or hand drying equipment shall be installed in convenient places in all food establishments and public and private markets.

SECTION 26. Adequate and clean toilet facilities for male, female, disabled customers and personnel shall be provided free of charge in all business establishments.

SECTION 27. Toilets shall not be near or open directly into spaces where food is prepared, stored or served.

SECTION 28. Appropriate grease traps shall be used in all food establishments as well as in households.

SECTION 29. For purposes of security and safety of its customers and personnel, VIP Rooms in all night clubs and similar establishments shall be allowed provided, its walls, partitions and doors are equipped with clear glass panels where activities inside can be observed and/or seen and fire safety is observed.

SECTION 30. All water sources are required to secure a Certificate of Potability of Drinking Water from the CHO. Likewise all food establishments shall undergo monthly bacteriological testing of their ice and water supplies.

**CHAPTER VI
WATER SUPPLY**

SECTION 31. The ice supply of food establishments must come from ice plants with Sanitary Permit. Ice plants are likewise subject to the requirements for water facilities under Chapter III of this Code.

Owners of high rise condominiums, hotels, motels, subdivisions and town houses are required to secure a Certificate of Potability of their water facilities every quarter of the year.

**CHAPTER VII
WASTE DISPOSAL**

SECTION 32. All owners, managers or operators of business establishments in Pasig City shall undergo a half-day Seminar on Proper Waste Disposal to be conducted by the Solid Waste Management Division of City Environment and Natural Resources Office (CENRO) in coordination with the Environmental Sanitation Division of the CHO prior to the issuance of a Sanitary Permit.

SECTION 33. All business establishments shall observe and practice solid waste segregation at source, exercise proper solid waste disposal and use appropriate recycling technologies.

SECTION 34. All business establishments shall provide for proper waste collection and storage and provide waste disposal bins/cans with tight fitting lids as to be vermin proof and easily cleanable. They shall also post "dispose off your solid waste properly, reuse, reduce and recycle!" signboards in areas where said storage disposal bins/cans are located. All market places shall have holding bins or solid waste storage area containers that must be maintained in a manner to be odor free, vermin and rodent proof. Individual stalls in public and private markets shall provide plastic bags for their recyclable, non-recyclable and food wastes.

SECTION 35. Any person, natural or juridical is prohibited from burning solid waste or any refuse materials within Pasig City.

SECTION 36. All industrial and commercial establishments are required to put and install adequate covered trash receptacles within their vicinity and maintain said receptacles in good condition; All gasoline stations and motor repair shops shall install grease traps and oil and water separator in the collection and disposal of oil products to be transferred in an empty steel drum with 200 liter capacity.

SECTION 37. Waste for disposal shall be kept inside the premises and shall only be brought outside, sealed, tied and/or properly placed in sacks or bags and properly identified as either recyclable, non-recyclable or hazardous immediately before the time for collection thereof by waste/garbage haulers. Dumping or disposing of any waste and/or carcass of animals or dead pets in/or along sidewalks, streets, creeks, rivers, vacant lots, parks and public places is strictly prohibited.

SECTION 38. All public utility vehicles plying the road within Pasig City are required to put garbage/trash receptacles inside their vehicles. Throwing of any form of garbage/trash into the streets of Pasig City from all types of vehicles is strictly prohibited. Garbage trucks or trucks loaded with loose materials are required to provide appropriate coverings over the materials being transported. The Traffic and Parking Management Office (TPMO) and the Batas ng Ciudad Enforcement Office (BCEO) will be in-charge of apprehending the violators of this Section.

CHAPTER VIII
VERMIN AND RODENT CONTROL

SECTION 39. An insect and vermin abatement program shall be undertaken by Certified and Licensed Pest Control Operator and Applicator duly licensed by the Fertilizer and Pesticide Authority (FPA). Only organic and environment friendly cleaning and disinfectant materials shall be used.

CHAPTER IX
CLASSIFICATION OF FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

SECTION 40. All food establishments shall be classified according to sanitation standards as follows:

1	EXCELLENT	Percentage rating shall not be lower than ninety percent (90%) of sanitary inspection evaluation.
2	VERY SATISFACTORY	Percentage not lower than seventy percent (70%).
3	SATISFACTORY	Percentage not lower than fifty percent (50%).

The Sanitary Permit of any food establishment that obtained a sanitary inspection evaluation below fifty percent (50%) shall be automatically CANCELLED.

All establishments must be classified in accordance with the foregoing categories and they shall apply for the said Sanitary Permit at the CHO and be evaluated upon payment of Food Establishment Classification/Sanitary Permit.

CHAPTER X
DANCING HALLS, NIGHT CLUBS, MASSAGE CLINICS,
SAUNA BATHS, MUSIC LOUNGES

SECTION 41. The following persons, regardless of their station of work, shall upon application for a working permit from the City Mayor and/or Occupational Health Certificate from the CHO, undergo compulsory laboratory examinations/tests :

GROUP A

- a. Waiters/Waitresses
- b. Floor Managers
- c. Bar Girls/Boys
- d. Models
- e. Dancers
- f. GROs/Receptionists
- g. Masseurs/masseuse
- h. Massage Clinic Attendants

GROUP B

- a. Cashiers
- b. Club Bouncers
- c. Bands/performers/artists
- d. Cooks
- e. Food Handlers
- f. Other Restaurant Workers
- g. Disc Jockeys
- h. Make-up Artists

Persons classified under Items c to f of Group A, are those employed in establishments generally operating at night, such as night clubs, discos and bars.

Failure to present proof that the abovementioned personnel have undergone the laboratory examinations/tests shall be ground for suspension or revocation of their Business Permit.

SECTION 42. The minimum tests required for those enumerated under Group A shall be the following :

1. Annual Syphilis Examination
2. Annual Hepatitis B Screening Test
3. Chest X-Ray
4. Seminar on STI/HIV/AIDS
5. Pictures : 1 x 1 and Whole Body
6. Filled up Bio-data Sheet from Social Hygiene Clinic
7. Birth Certificate
8. Police Clearance
9. *Community Tax Certificate*
10. Regular twice a month vaginal smear
11. Drug Test
12. HIV/AIDS Screening (OPTIONAL)

The minimum tests required for those enumerated under Group B shall be the following:

1. Routine Urinalysis
2. Fecalysis
3. Drug Test
4. Chest X-Ray (valid for one (1) year)

SECTION 43. All personnel, in addition, shall undergo STD Seminar prior to the issuance of a Health Certificate. Food Handlers shall, in addition undergo a Food Handler seminar.

SECTION 44. All establishments employing persons required to undergo the examinations/tests provided in this Chapter shall have the responsibility of ensuring that their personnel submit themselves for testing as required under this Code. Failure to present proof that their personnel had undergone the tests required in this Chapter or to account for such previously tested shall be a ground for suspension or revocation of their Business License Permit.

The establishment whose GROs are going on leave, inactive status or has resigned from their employment, should notify the Social Hygiene Clinic. A smear examination will be conducted if the said GRO are to be reinstated.

SECTION 45. GROs must visit the Social Hygiene Clinic of the City Health Office twice a month for their check ups. Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI) which includes gonorrhoea, trichomoniasis and candidiasis are determined during the said scheduled clinic visits.

ID must be presented for the required twice a month vaginal smear examinations. Identified positive (+) cases of Sexually Transmitted Diseases are not allowed to work and their respective IDs shall be temporarily confiscated unless the diseases ~~is~~ are eradicated through proper medications. Repeat vaginal smear examination should be negative (-) prior to reinstating the said GROs to work.

CHAPTER XI
OFFENSIVE TRADES AD OCCUPATIONS

SECTION 46. No animal stockade for livestock industry shall be maintained and operated within Pasig City. Keeping of any kind of livestock animal intended for butchering in any premises within Pasig City for more than three (3) days shall constitute a violation of this Section. However, a septic tank must be provided for their animal wastes.

SECTION 47. Stockade of game cocks and other animals for trade and/or for breeding shall be allowed only upon securing the necessary Sanitary Permit provided that proper sanitary standards are maintained such as :

1. Adequate water supply for drinking and cleaning and for other domestic purposes of at least thirty (30) liters per day/fifty (50) heads shall be provided in said stockades;
2. It shall be provided with a watertight, easy to carry and vermin proof receptacle for manure and for other litters generated by the said stockade;
3. It shall not be located within twenty five (25) meters from any ground and surface drinking water source nor it shall be located in flood prone areas or hospitals;

4. Vermin abatement program shall be maintained by the operator;
5. Disinfection shall be undertaken at least three (3) times a week or as frequent as necessary;
6. All animal feeds shall be kept and stored under such conditions that will prevent the attraction and harborage of vermin and other insects;
7. Adequate sanitation shall always be observed to prevent obnoxious odors that may arise from the said stockade;
8. In residential areas (classified in the Zoning Classification), there shall be no breeding of game cocks and other types of fowls as well as livestock/hog raising activities;
9. Other similar measures to maintain the healthy and sanitary conditions of the said stock premises.

CHAPTER XII
TONSORIAL AND BEAUTY ESTABLISHMENTS

SECTION 48. Tonsorial or beauty establishments shall be required to secure the proper Sanitary Permit from the CHO.

SECTION 49. All personnel of the said establishment are required to secure Health Certificate subject to the provisions of Chapter II and Chapter X of this Code.

SECTION 50. The following sanitary practices shall be observed in the said establishments at all times:

1. Working personnel shall wash their hands with soap and water before servicing customers;
2. They shall wear clean working garments;
3. They shall not smoke nor eat while working;

4. Instruments of their trade like nipper, pusher, scissors, razors and nail cutters shall be cleaned and disinfected before and after their use with any approved soaking solutions and their derivatives which are organic or environment friendly;
5. Customers shall be supplied with clean and fresh towels, drapes and other necessities;
6. Precautionary measures to prevent disease transmission shall be observed when serving customers with any form of dermatomes;

CHAPTER XIII
CATERERS, FOOD BOOTHS, STALLS, CARTS
AND AMBULANT VENDORS

SECTION 51. No person or entity shall operate any of the service and/or trade under this Chapter without securing a Sanitary Permit.

SECTION 52. All operators and/or personnel engaged in such services and/or trade shall secure a Health Certificate in accordance with Chapter 11 of this Code.

SECTION 53. The following sanitation requirements shall always be observed by the operators and/or personnel of such services and/or trade covered by this Chapter at all times:

1. All food containers shall be completely enclosed or sealed and leak proof to prevent the possibility of contamination and spillage;
2. All transport vehicles used in the said services/trade shall be kept clean and no substance capable of contaminating the food or food products shall be transported with the food or food products in such manner as to permit contamination;
3. All food containers used in their services/trade shall be completely enclosed or sealed and leak proof to prevent the possibility of contamination and spillage;

4. All food booths, stalls, carts or similar structure shall be so constructed that food, drinks and other utensils shall not be exposed to insects, dust and other contaminants;
5. Adequate supply of safe water shall be made easily available for use in cleaning kitchen utensils and equipment;
6. All food booths and the like shall be provided with proper storage and holding facilities to maintain the food or drinks, hot or cold, as maybe required by the type of food or drinks to be served;
7. Ice shall come from the duly approved sources and stored and hauled hygienically as to avoid contamination;
8. All solid wastes shall be kept in tight receptacles. Containers for segregated solid wastes shall be made available at all times;
9. Water and other liquid wastes shall be disposed of in a sanitary manner so as not to create nuisances and to prevent them from attracting disease bearing insects or bacteria;

CHAPTER XIV
INDUSTRIAL AND OTHER NON-FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

SECTION 54. All industrial/commercial and other non-food establishments shall obtain Sanitary Permit and Environment Permit to Operate and personnel of which shall secure Health Certificates.

SECTION 55. All establishments covered by this Chapter are required to provide the following facilities and programs in accordance with the provisions of this Code:

1. Adequate and conveniently located toilet facilities;
2. Proper facilities/receptacles for segregation of recyclables, non-recyclables and hazardous wastes shall be provided at all times to prevent health hazard, nuisance and pollution.

4. Adequate sanitary maintenance for all work areas, hall ways, grounds, machineries and equipment to ensure the safety of employees;
5. Canteens and/or eating places that conform to the requirements of food establishments under this Code;
6. Potable drinking water for employees;

CHAPTER XV
CLEANING UP OF SURROUNDINGS

SECTION 56. All residents and establishments are hereby directed to regularly clean up their immediate surroundings, remove or cover all possible breeding places of disease carrying insects such as but not limited to *Aedes Aegypti* mosquitoes which causes dengue infections.

SECTION 57. The Barangays through its Committee on Health shall conduct a monthly clean up drive of public vacant lands, canals, creeks and other water systems that are breeding places of disease carrying insects such as but not limited to *Aedes Aegypti* mosquitoes in coordination with the CHO and with the support of City Engineering Office.

CHAPTER XVII
INSTITUTIONAL MECHANISMS

SECTION 60. The CHO – it shall :

1. be mandated as to be the lead agency tasked to implement and enforce this Code. For this purpose, it may enlist the support of the Business Permit and License Office (BPLO), CENRO, the Philippine National Police (PNP) and any other government agency as it may deem it necessary;
2. undertake information, education and communication activities required under this Code and on timely health and sanitation concerns;
3. work for the necessary and adequate manpower and logistical support to the City Mayor and City Council respectively to ensure the successful implementation of this Code and the latter is mandated to provide the said support;
4. ensure the involvement NGOs as partners through the spirit of *bayanihan* in the programs and services of the CHO;
5. work out with the Division of City Schools the inclusion of Health and Sanitation, Reproductive Health, STD/HIV and other timely health and sanitation concerns in the elementary and secondary curricula;
6. other matters which the City Mayor may assign for the successful implementation of this Code.

SECTION 61. The City Health Laboratory or duly CHO accredited private laboratory shall conduct all laboratory tests and radiological examinations required under Section 5, Chapter II hereof to ensure the authenticity and correctness of the results of laboratory/radiological examinations.

Likewise, it shall draw up a criteria/standards for the accreditation of private laboratory and shall impose a corresponding accreditation fee.

Third Offense : Fine of five hundred pesos (PhP500.00) and community work of fifty hours (50 hrs).

30. For violation of Section 39, Chapter VIII, the penalties are as follows :

First Offense : Warning and fifteen (15) days grace period to comply.

**CHAPTER XIX
MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

SECTION 64. ANTI - POLLUTION DEVICE. All business establishments shall install an effective anti-pollution device to address water, air and odor pollutions in compliance with existing national laws such as the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act, the Clean Air Act, and the Clean Water Act.

SECTION 65. INTERFERENCE - Any person who shall interfere, hinder or oppose any official or member of the CHO as well as those of the offices designated such as the Traffic and Parking Management Office (TPMO) and other offices to be designated, in the performance of their duties in the implementation of this Sanitation Code, or shall tear down, mutilate, deface or alter any billboard, streamer, poster or similar notices affixed in the premises in the enforcement of this Code shall be guilty of misdemeanor.

No City Government Official/s or Employee/s shall be allowed to transact directly with any establishment for the facilitation of issuance of Health Certificate/s and Business Permits.

SECTION 66. CITIZEN'S SUITS. For the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this Code, any bona fide Pasig City resident may file an appropriate civil, criminal or administrative action in proper courts/bodies against :

1. any person who violates or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Code;

2. any Pasig City Official or Employee who willfully or grossly neglects the performance of an act specially enjoined as a duty by this Code; or abuse his/her authority in the performance of his/her duties; or in any manner, improperly performs his/her duties under Code. Provided, however, that no suit can be filed until after thirty day (30) notice has been given to the said public officer and the alleged violator concerned and no appropriate action has been taken thereon.

The Court shall exempt such action from the payment of filing fees and shall likewise, upon prima facie showing of non-enforcement or violation complained of, exempt the plaintiff from the filing of an injunction bond for the issuance of a preliminary injunction.

In the event the said bona fide Pasig City resident should prevail, the Court shall award reasonable attorney's fees, moral damages and litigation costs as appropriate.

SECTION 67.

SUITS AND STRATEGIC ACTION AGAINST PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF THIS CODE - Where a suit is brought against a person who filed an action as provided for on Section 67, Chapter XIX of this Code, or against any person, office or department that implements this Code, it shall be the duty of the City Prosecutor to immediately make a determination not exceeding thirty days (30 dy) whether said legal action has been filed to harass, vex, exert undue pressure or stifle such legal recourse of the person complaining of or enforcing the provisions of this Code. Upon determination thereof, evidence warranting the same, the Prosecutor shall dismiss the same.

This provision shall also apply and benefit Pasig City Officials and Employees who were sued for acts committed in their official capacity, there being no grave abuse of authority and done in the course of enforcing this Code.


SECTION 68. APPLICABILITY OF ORDINANCES, THE SANITATION CODE OF THE PHILIPPINES, THE ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT ACT, THE CLEAN AIR ACT, THE CLEAN WATER ACT AND THE COMPREHENSIVE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT. The Provisions of Ordinance Numbers 25 s. 1992, 18 s, 2000, 29 s 2002, 30 s. 2000s and 43 s. 2004 that are not inconsistent with this Code shall remain enforceable and are hereby adopted as part hereof. The Sanitation Code of the Philippines, the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act, the Clean Air Act, the Clean Water Act and the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act, their Implementing Rules and Regulations and other laws shall apply to all matters not provided in this Code.


SECTION 69. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE. If, for any reason, any part or provision of this Code shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected, shall continue to be in full force and in effect.


SECTION 70. REPEALING CLAUSE. All ordinances and administrative circulars and executive orders or parts thereof which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Code, are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.


