AN ORDINANCE FOR THE CREATION OF PASIG PEOPLE'S LAW ENFORCEMENT BOARD (PLEB), AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Section 1. Purpose. - There is hereby created Pasig People's Law Enforcement Board (PLEB) for the City of Pasig, who shall have jurisdiction to hear and decide citizen's complaints or cases filed before it against erring members of the Philippine National Police assigned in the City;

Section 2. Governing Laws. - This Ordinance shall be governed by, but not limited to, the national laws.

- Republic Act No. 7160, "Local Government Code of the Philippines"
- Republic Act No. 6975, "Department of the Interior and Local Government Act of 1990"
- Republic Act No. 8551, "Philippine National Police Reforms and Reorganization Act of 1998"
- NAPOLCOM Memorandum Circular No. 2016-002 dated March 7, 2016".

Section 3. Composition. - The PLEB shall be composed of the following:

- A member of the Sangguniang Panlungsod chosen by the Sanggunian;
- A Punong Barangay chosen by the Liga ng mga Barangay;
- Three (3) other members who shall be chosen by the City Peace and Order Council from among the respected members of the community known for their probity and integrity, one (1) of whom must be a woman, and another member of the Bar or, in the absence thereof, a college graduate, or the principal of the central elementary school.

The chairperson of PLEB shall be elected from among its members.

Except as provided in this Section or as may be provided by law, a public official or employee is disqualified for appointment or designation as member of the PLEB.

Applying the provisions of Article 152, Chapter IV, Title III, Book II of the Revised Penal Code⁴, the members of the PLEB are considered persons in authority.

Section 4. Term of Office. - The term of office of the members of the PLEB shall be for a period of two (2) years from assumption of office. Such member shall hold office until his successor shall have been chosen and qualified. The tenure of office of a PLEB, member who has been designated as such by virtue of his election to the Sangguniang Panlungsod or his membership with the Liga ng mga Barangay ends upon the expiration of his term of office as Sangguniang Panlungsod member or as Punong Barangay. If re-elected, and subsequently re-designated to the PLEB, he must take a new oath of office.

Section 5. Functions, Powers and Duties. - The PLEB shall exercise the following functions, powers and duties:

- Conduct hearings, resolve and decide on cases filed against erring member of the Philippine National Police in the city.
- Establish linkages with other government agencies and initiate contacts with Non-Government Organizations in the community for a wider network of alliance in the fight to restore order and discipline among the members of the PNP and maintain goodwill towards the church and church oriented groups for moral advantage of the PLEB.
- Campaign for public awareness and citizen's participation to the PLEB through information dissemination by incorporating in the Barangay seminars/dialogue subject matters pertaining to PLEB.
- Conduct seminars for the PLEB to assist in improving professionalism, restore discipline and credibility among the members of the police force.
- Attend and host in the conduct of conference-dialogue with other PLEB.
- Coordinate with the Chief of Police and National Police Commission to make the PLEB feel its relevance in maintaining peace and order.
- Draft possible amendments to existing laws governing the PLEB taking the PLEB experience into account.
- Perform such functions as may be assigned by Ordinance.

Section 6. Oath. - People's Law Enforcement Board members before assuming the duties of their office, the Chairperson and members of the PLEB shall take an oath before an administering officer which shall be filed with the Office of NAPOLCOM in NCR.

Section 7. Allowance. – Members of the PLEB are entitled to an allowance of P5,000.00 per month or in such amount as may be determined by the Sanggunian. The Secretariat not to exceed three (3) shall receive Php2,500.00 each per month.

Section 8. Quorum. – The presence of three (3) members of the PLEB shall constitute a quorum: Provided, however, that a vote of at least three (3) members shall be required in rendering a decision.

If for any reason, the chairperson is absent or is disqualified from participating the hearing, the members, there being a quorum, shall elect from among themselves a temporary chairperson to perform the duties of a chairperson.

When a PLEB member, after sufficient notice, fails or refuses to attend the hearings and/or deliberations of the Board without any valid and justifiable reason and it could not proceed of lack of quorum, the Chairperson or the designated presiding officer may request the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the Liga ng mga Barangay or the City Peace and Order Council, as the case may be, to designate a temporary representative to enable the body to constitute a quorum: Provided, that such temporary representative shall act as such only for the specific case.

Section 9. Disqualification by Reason of Affinity or Consanguinity.
– The Chairperson or any member of the PLEB who is related to the complainant or respondent by affinity or consanguinity within the fourth civil degree shall be disqualified from participating in the proceeding and the case shall be tried by the remaining members: Provided, that there is a quorum, the Peace and Order Council, the Sangguniang Panlungsod or the Liga ng mga Barangay of the city concerned shall appoint a temporary member for that specific case only.

Section 10. Procedure. –

- a) The PLEB, by a majority vote of all its members and its chairperson shall determine whether or not the respondent officer or members is guilty of the charge upon which the complaint is based.
- b) Each case shall be decided within sixty (60) days from the time that it was filed.

- c) The hearing shall be summary in nature, conducted in accordance with due process, but without strict regard to technical rules of evidence.

Section 11. Finality of Decision. – The disciplinary action imposed upon a member of the PNP shall be final and executor: Provided, that a disciplinary action imposed by the PNP Regional Director or by the PLEB involving demotion or dismissal from the service may be appealed to the RAB within ten (10) days from receipt of the copy of the notice of decision: Provided, further, that the disciplinary action imposed by the Chief of the PNP involving demotion or dismissal may be appealed to the NAB within ten (10) days from receipt thereof.

Section 12. Repealing Clause. – Any Ordinance, part or provision thereof which is in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance, is hereby deemed repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

Section 13. Effectivity. – This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
