**AN ORDINANCE GRANTING AMNESTY TO DELINQUENT TRAFFIC VIOLATORS IN PASIG CITY WITH UNREDEEMED ORDINANCE VIOLATION RECEIPTS (OVRs), BY CONDONING THE 2% PENALTY PER DAY IMPOSED BY SECTION 122 (C) OF THE REVISED 2016 TRAFFIC AND PARKING MANAGEMENT CODE OF PASIG CITY, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance No. 23, Series of 2016, as amended, otherwise known as the Revised 2016 Traffic and Management Code of Pasig City, authorized the implementation and issuance of Ordinance Violation Receipts (OVR) to violators of traffic laws;

**WHEREAS**, Section 122 (c) of the Revised 2016 Traffic and Management Code of Pasig City accords a violator five (5) days from the date of violation within which to present the OVR, pay the fine, redeem his/her license, and imposes an additional surcharge of two percent (2%) for each working day of delay or failure to pay the appropriate fine;

**WHEREAS**, Section 192 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991 allows local government units to grant tax exemptions, incentives or reliefs through duly approved ordinances, under such terms and conditions as they may deem necessary;

**WHEREAS**, the Sangguniang Panlungsod of Pasig previously passed Ordinance No. 14, Series of 2019, in recognition of the fact that the grant of amnesty within a period of 6 months from the passage of Ordinance No. 14, Series of 2019 would: (a) give delinquent traffic violators (most of whom were poor tricycle and jeepney drivers) the opportunity to redeem their confiscated licenses at reduced and more affordable amount, and to start driving and making a living for their families again; and (b) encourage delinquent traffic violators to settle their obligations and, in the process, facilitate the collection of revenues for the city which would have been difficult to collect otherwise;

**WHEREAS**, the Traffic and Parking Management Office (TPMO), which in charge with collecting fines, penalties, and surcharges for violations of the Revised 2016 Traffic and Parking Management Code, has recommended that the amnesty previously extended by Ordinance No. 14, Series of 2019, be granted anew

**WHEREAS**, the need to allow the public utility drivers and minimum wage earners a chance to continue earning a living must be balanced by considerations of public welfare and safety;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PASIG, IN REGULAR SESSION DULY ASSEMBLED:**

**SECTION 1.** – There is hereby granted an amnesty to delinquent traffic violators in Pasig City who were issued OVRs, by condoning the two percent (2%) penalty per day imposed under Section 122 (c) of the Revised 2016 Traffic and Parking Management Code of Pasig City, subject to following terms and condition upon redemption:

- a. The violator must still pay the basic fine;
- b. The violator must pay a blanket surcharge of ten percent (10%) or, if unable to pay the surcharge, render one (1) hour of community service for every fifty pesos (P50.00) surcharge under the supervision of either the TPMO or the Pasig City Clean and Green Office; and
- c. A violator with three (3) or more OVRs must undergo a seminar on the provisions of the Revised 2016 Traffic and Parking Management Code, as scheduled by the TPMO.

**SECTION 2.** – The amnesty shall be granted only to those who were apprehended before the publication of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 3.** – The amnesty granted herein can be availed of only until December 31, 2021.

**SECTION 4.** – This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
